

## A Letter to School

Write a letter to your child's teacher to tell them about your child. You can include some of the things that were discussed so far in the module. Tell them something that might help them better understand your child or your home. Consider sharing some of the following in the letter:

- Is there something that could benefit your child and their schooling if you shared it with their teacher?
- Do you need to know more about what is happening with your child at school?

### Sample letter:

He is a very busy boy and very smart. He helps me at home with making shopping lists and likes making lists of things we need to do. I would like to know how much homework there will be this year and if there is something I can do at home to get him to do all of the homework, not just the reading. I want him to be a good student in school.

I work all day and it is hard for me to come to school in the middle of the day. I would like to talk to you about Sam's homework. I bring him to school in the mornings if you are able to talk to me at that time.
